

New England Food Processors' Collective

- Coordination of shared systems:
 - Sourcing from regional farms
 - Marketing and promotion
 - Ordering and sales





Streamline distribution



- Investment in infrastructure and relationships
 - Equipment
 - Advance planning with farms and buyers



Pilot: Forward Contracts

- Goal: share risk across the food system between farmers, processors, and purchasers.
- Pilot use of contracts between processors and institutions in 2019
 - Expand to include contracts between farmers and processors in 2020
- Pilot participants:
 - Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center
 - Boston Children's Hospital
 - RiverWoods Retirement Community



Pilot Process

- Email to share products and prices
- Phone call to discuss project goals, processors, and items of interest
- Taste tests On-site at facilities with chefs and purchasers
- Finalize products, volumes, prices, and distribution details
- 5. Transactions are slated to begin in June 2019



The Contract: Product Details

The Contracts: Sourcing Details

The Processor agrees to source the raw ingredients for all products from New England based producers. If products are unavailable within the region they will look to source from the Northeast (defined by the U.S. Department of Agriculture as VA through ME). If products are unavailable within the Northeast, the Processors will notify the purchaser that the product will be unavailable.

Notification will be made at least 14 days in advance of expected delivery.



The Contract: Down Payment


- (institution) agrees to pay 20 percent of the total cost of product (total volume July through Dec 2019) by May 1, 2019. This will enable processors to provide farmers with a fair price and a reliable payment schedule. The remainder of payments will be made within 30 days of receipt of product.
- Should _____ (institution) decide to terminate the agreement between May 1, 2019 and the week of the first delivery there will be a 50 percent refund on the deposit.
- Should _____ (institution) decide to terminate the agreement on or after the week of the first delivery there will be no refund of the deposit.
